


Will Robotic Process Automation change the face of the SSO industry?

There is a growing recognition within the SSO industry that our community is not immune to the digital forces reshaping the economy, and 63% of our attendees see the potential of robotic process automation (RPA) to revolutionise the industry.


How confident are you that your current model suits the changing business environment?
